- [BAGLY](#) provides free mental and behavioral health services to LGBTQ youth, ages 25 and under.
- [Boston GLASS](#) provides mental and behavioral health services to LGBTQ youth of color, ages 13-29.
- [Transcares](#) provides a searchable list of therapists, doctors, and other health care providers who are affirming of trans individuals.
