### “Building a Cross Sectoral Movement When the Sky is Falling”

**Elizabeth Yeampierre** is an internationally recognized Puerto Rican climate justice leader of Black and Indigenous ancestry, born and raised in New York City. Yeampierre is co-chair of the Climate Justice Alliance, a national frontline-led organization, and executive director of UPROSE, Brooklyn's oldest Latino community-based organization.

Yeampierre was the first Latina chair of the US Environmental Protection Agency's National Environmental Justice Advisory Council and opening speaker for the first White House Forum on Environmental Justice, hosted by the Obama administration. Yeampierre has been featured in the media and celebrated with honors many times, including a *New York Times* article that portrayed her as a visionary paving the path to climate justice. *Apolitical* included her in its list of the “100 Most Influential People in Climate Policy,” she has been featured in *Vogue* as one of 13 international climate warriors, included in “Oprah’s List of Future Rising” and recognized in *TIME* magazine’s 2025 “The Closers” list and *People* magazine’s “20 Most Empowering Latinos Fighting Climate Change.” She has been a featured speaker at Oxford University, The Hague and the Pasteur Institute in Paris.
