

Doe/Moe/Jones v. Bondi: A Case Study

Jennifer Levi and Dee Farmer will discuss three consolidated cases filed for incarcerated transgender women facing transfer to men's facilities—challenging the federal “Gender Ideology” executive order and its prison rollout. Farmer, a trailblazing transgender rights advocate whose landmark prison case reached the Supreme Court and helped establish prison officials’ duty to protect people from known risks of sexual violence, offers unmatched context.
